COTTON NEWS

- * The Texas AgriLife Extension Service is sponsoring cotton meetings in many counties across Texas. For more information on specific counties see: <http://county-tx.tamu.edu/>.
- * Cotton growers have an updated tool to calculate seed cost for their 2008 acres. The updated version of the Plains Cotton Growers Seed Cost Calculator was released earlier this month. The calculator includes data for 129 conventional and genetically modified varieties of cotton available to cotton growers in West Texas. The PCG calculator is an interactive Microsoft Excel spreadsheet that allows producers to calculate an estimated cost per acre, for both seed and technology, based on published suggested retail prices. - * Textile mills worldwide are expected to mill 3 percent more cotton this year than in previous years according to the International Cotton Advisory Committee. This is less of an increase than recent years, but is more than the 2 percent long-term average increase. Experts attribute the slowed rate of increase to a forecasted decline in economic growth, an increase in international cotton price and the competition from polyester.
